- Language: English
- Word Limit: no more than 500 words
- Template for submitting an Abstract

[Using Times New Roman with 12 font and single line spacing]

- Poster Title (limited to 30 words in UPPER CASE):
- Abstract (max. 500 words):
 - **Background**
 - **Purpose(s)/ Objective(s)**
 - **Methods**
 - **Results**
 - **Conclusions**
- Please do not include tables, figures, abbreviations and references in the abstract

Best Presentation Awards

- Research idea – Original, meaningful and insightful implications
- Methodology and Analysis – clear, precise, in-depth analysis and interpretation of data
- Discussion – Well researched and discussed with evidence and critical assessment
- Poster design – clear visual and design
